

**Hannah Courser Joslin**  
**(March 25,1796-December 8, 1860)<sup>1</sup>**

Hannah was born in Prince William March 25, 1796 probably the daughter of John and Mary Courser. John was a New York Loyalist who had been an engineer and who had received land in Prince William.<sup>2</sup>She was the eighth of 11 children.<sup>3</sup>

Hannah married William Cook Joslin on October 5, 1819.<sup>4</sup> they had 5 children, Thankful (1821-1864) who married George Wheeler (1819-1880) and moved to Florenceville, Daniel Cook (1828-1906), Simon (1835-1878), Olive Ann (1825-), Priscilla (1839-) and John A (1819-)<sup>5</sup>.

On December 8, 1860, Hannah became sick and passed away.<sup>6</sup> She was buried in the Prince William Cemetery.<sup>7</sup>
