


## Black History Month Crossword

Born in 1828 in St. Andrews, New Brunswick, Edward Mitchell would become one of
the first prominent Black artists in the United States.
In 1796, a group of approximately 600 adults and children, knows as The, were sent
against their will to Halifax from Jamaica after fighting for their freedom from British rule.
Born in 1851 in Belleisle, New Brunswick, Abraham Beverley was the first Black lawyer
in New Brunswick.
Born in Woodstock, NB in 1882, Mary Matilda (Tilly) was the first female Black Canadian
to attend and graduate from the University of New Brunswick.
The Taylor Collection at Kings Landing contains artifacts belonging to George Rexford
and his descendants, who were some of the early members of the Black community in the
Fredericton area.
Charlotte was a prominent figure in Springfield Parish, NB who now has a bridge
named in her honour.
The community of, NB is considered the first to forbid slavery in British North
America.
Members of the Black community helped build St. Peter's Anglican Church located near the
Fredericton city limits in It was completed in 1838.
The House at Kings Landing is dedicated to telling stories from New Brunswick's Black
history.
One of New Brunswick's first Black settlements,, was featured on Canada Post's
Black History Month stamp series in 2021.
