Meeting & Conference Options

Choose from the options below to find the ideal meeting location.

The Learning Centre

A recently renovated building, the Learning Centre offers a modern space with plenty of natural light and several washrooms.

Booking Fee: \$800

Capacity: 80 guests maximum

Availability:

- June, September & October: Daily from 10am - 5pm
- July & August: Saturday & Sunday, 10am-5pm.



The King's Head Inn

This 19th century inn located in the heart of the Village offers an old fashioned experience with several meeting room options for large and small groups. Choose the room(s) most suitable for your meeting needs.

Simeon Jones Room

Our largest room with a cozy fireplace available for evening meetings.

Booking Fee: \$750

Capacity: 90 guests maximum

Availability: June to October, 7 days per week after 5pm

Holyoke Double Parlour

Two adjoining rooms located near the entrance to the Inn. The rooms can be booked separately or together for an intimate meeting space.

Booking Fee: \$200 each / \$400 adjoined

Capacity: 16 guests maximum each / 32 guests maximum adjoined

Availability: June to October, 7 days per week from 10am - 5pm

Royal Albert Room & Victoria Room

Two small rooms located in a quieter area of the Inn suitable for a small group. These rooms are separate and cannot be adjoined.

Booking Fee: \$200 each

Capacity: 16 guests maximum each

Availability: June to October, 7 days per week from 10am - 5pm

Enhance your meeting or conference with a meal or step outside to explore our historical village.

Food Services

Coffee Break: Treat your group to a refreshing coffee break with snacks, tea, and coffee for \$50.

Meal: Order a soup and sandwich meal for your guests for \$15.99 per person.

Most dietary needs and restrictions can be met with advanced notice.

Guided Tour

Stretch your legs and learn a little history on a 60-minute guided tour of the village. This option is only available for groups of 15 or more.

Fee: \$25 per person (minimum 15 people)

Self-guided Visit

Allow your guests to step outside and explore the village at their own pace.

Fee: \$19 per person for groups of 15 or more. / Regular admission rates apply for groups of less than 15 people.

Projector Rental

Rent a projector and screen for your event for \$300.



Meeting Information & Guidelines

In addition to the terms and conditions on contracts between clients and Kings Landing, the following rules apply when hosting a meeting or conference at Kings Landing. We appreciate your cooperation to ensure everyone has an excellent experience.

Equipment: Clients booking a meeting are welcome to bring their own presentation equipment as agreed upon during booking. Equipment rentals are available for an extra fee. Please ask for more information during booking.

Set up: The facility rental fee includes chairs and tables set up according to the number of guests and your preferred floor plan. Floor plans must be finalized at least one week prior to your booking. Please note that you are not permitted to begin your personal set up prior to the agreed-upon booking time. Other fees may apply if additional setup is required by Kings Landing staff.

Capacity: Fire Department regulations stating the maximum occupancy for each facility are posted. The client is responsible for ensuring this regulation is always enforced.

Smoking: Smoking is only permitted in parking lots at Kings Landing.

Animals & environment: Dedicated farmers, gardeners, and labourers work diligently to maintain the animals and natural environment at Kings Landing. Please do not feed the animals or enter their pastures or enclosures. While they are familiar with people, animals are unpredictable by nature; as such, we request all guests respect our farm animals and any other wildlife they may encounter. Likewise, guests are expected to respect the natural environment at Kings Landing including gardens, lawns, trees, plants, and roadways.

Parking: Kings Landing has designated parking lots with ample, free parking. No vehicles are permitted on the museum grounds. Please do not park on grassy areas. The main parking lot by the Welcome Centre is open from 10 am - 5 pm daily from June to October. If your event is after hours and/or located on the east side of the site, please enter through the service entrance road located on Route 102. Public Hours of Operation: Please note that some of these guidelines may change or there may be limitations for meetings scheduled between 10 am - 5 pm while Kings Landing is open to the general public.

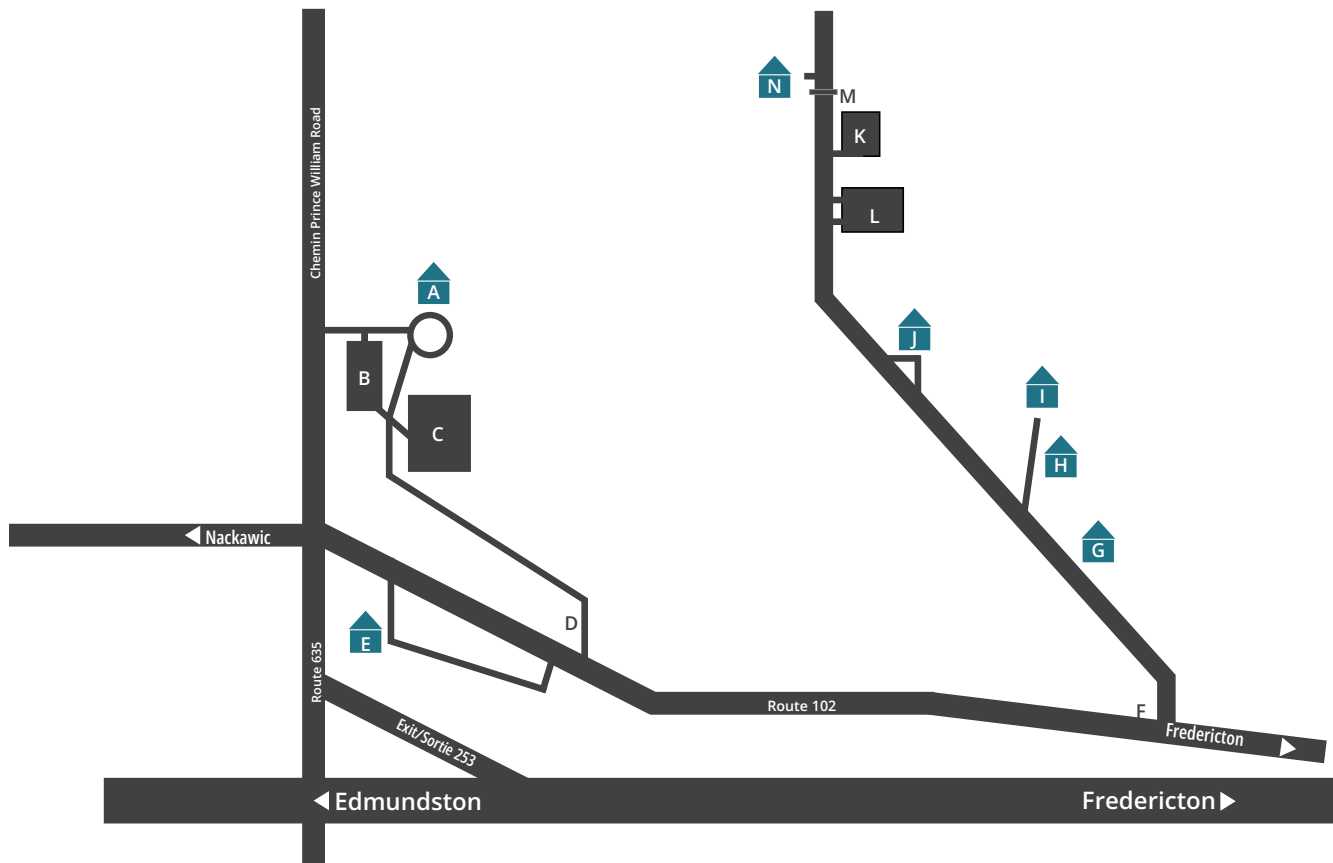
