

Welcome to the Kings Landing Walking Club! With year-round access to the Kings Landing site, you are embarking on a great journey to the past.

Walking Club Rules

- Entrance is permitted from dawn to dusk daily (see parking and check-in details below).
- You must use the sign-in/out log if visiting outside of operating hours. During operating hours, participants are encouraged to log their kilometres at the admissions desk.
- Only service animals are permitted on site.
- Stay on designated roadways.
- No smoking in undesignated areas.
- Do not enter any buildings.
- Do not access the river.
- Do not pick flowers or vegetables from gardens on the property.

Please be aware that outside of operating hours, you may encounter modern equipment and staff vehicles on the site. These are off-limits. The buildings will be closed and no washroom access available.

During Open Season (End of May - Mid-October)

Primary check-in point: <u>Welcome Centre admissions desk</u> during operating hours (10am-5pm). Vehicles must vacate by 5pm.

Outside of operating hours: Check-in point and parking located at the <u>Kings Landing Administration Building</u> located at 5804 Route 102, across from the main entrance. A self-serve kiosk is here for a sign-in/out log, maps, and safety information.

During Off-Season (Mid-October - Mid-May)

Check-in point and parking: <u>Kings Landing Administration Building</u> located at 5804 Route 102, across from the main entrance. A self-serve kiosk is here for a sign-in/out log, maps, and safety information.

Please note that the site may close for weather or other related reasons. Communications will be made on social media and via email to walking club members.

You must be a current season passholder to be part of the Walking Club and access the site outside of operating hours. We will confirm your season pass status. Season passes run from January to December of the year on the pass. We can't wait to meet you in the village.
